This program is not eligible for financial aid. Students taking EMT coursework as part of a related program, such as the AGS in Health Professions Exploration degree (<https://catalog.mhcc.edu/degree-certificate-requirements/ags-health-professions-exploration/>), may be eligible for financial aid and should work with a financial aid advisor.

The **Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)** program is designed for students seeking careers in emergency medical services and pre-hospital healthcare. The curriculum prepares students to provide basic emergency medical care and respond to emergency situations in collaboration with paramedics, physicians, and other healthcare professionals.

Coursework includes **didactic, practical, clinical, and field internship training based on the National Standard Curriculum established by the U.S. Department of Transportation and National Highway Traffic Safety Administration**. Students develop practical skills in patient assessment, emergency response, airway management, bleeding control, and trauma care.

The EMT program is workforce-focused and prepares students to take the State of Oregon EMT Basic and National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) examinations. The six-month training program is accredited by the Oregon Department of Education and the Oregon Health Authority EMS & Trauma Systems Program.

Students are encouraged to work with an advisor (<https://www.mhcc.edu/student-resources/academic-advising/>) to ensure appropriate course selection and program planning based on their educational background and career goals.

How to Apply

The **Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)** program is a limited-entry program. The program admits approximately 30 students each fall and spring term. Because space is limited, students must meet program

eligibility requirements and complete the application process before enrolling in EMT coursework.

Application Steps

Step 1: Apply to MHCC

Students should apply for admission to Mt. Hood Community College.

Step 2: Review Program Eligibility Requirements

Students must complete any required placement, prerequisite, or eligibility requirements prior to program entry.

Students must submit all required application materials during the published application period.
